Discover Your Potential

What is Leadership Tomorrow?

A youth program of Leadership Worthington designed for students in grades 9 (second semester), 10, 11 and 12 and who live in the Worthington School District. The program is offered twice each school year, first semester and again second semester.

What is the Mission of Leadership Tomorrow?

To identify existing and emerging teen leaders and develop their potential for school and civic responsibility, enhance their understanding of leadership issues, and motivate them to work toward resolving these issues for the betterment of the Worthington area community.

Who Should Participate?

Students in grades 9 (second semester), 10, 11 and 12 and who live in the Worthington School District.

Students who have leadership abilities and have demonstrated them formally and/or informally.

Students who have leadership potential and the desire to develop that potential.

What Leadership Components are Included in the Program?

- Self-assessment
 - o To enhance self-awareness and leadership styles, self-expression and social interaction.
- Team building
 - o To participate in a series of team building initiatives in order to understand that effective teamwork is an integral part of the leadership process.

- Communication and Presentation Preparation
 - o To explore various public speaking styles and to practice presentation techniques. Students will create a presentation, practice presentation skills and receive immediate feedback.
- Community Service
 - o To continue emphasis on the importance of community involvement through volunteerism. Students will identify volunteer opportunities of interest to them, handle pre-planning tasks and complete the service time. Outcomes and experiences are then presented at the graduation event.
- Service Presentations
 - o To implement what has been learned about effective communication, public speaking and presentation techniques, and to share information about the service learning experience. Presentations are completed at the graduation event.
- Attendance at the first and last sessions are both mandatory. Of the remaining five sessions, a maximum of one session may be missed to qualify for graduation from the program.
- Students are encouraged to participate in the annual Leadership Worthington Service Day on the first Saturday in May.
- \$145 program tuition, payable to Leadership Worthington, 200 E. Wilson Bridge, Worthington, 43085. Financial assistance is available. A \$60.00 non-refundable deposit is due at the time of application.
- The \$85.00 balance of the program tuition is due by the start date of the program.
- Class size is limited. Applications will be processed in the order in which they are received.

What are the Enrollment and Attendance Requirements?

- Students must complete the program application.
- Students must attend seven (3 hour) sessions. Sessions are held on Sunday afternoons.

In addition to the seven class sessions, students must identify a community service opportunity and complete a minimum of **5 hours** of direct service time.
